Tech Tip

Occasionally we run across sewer connections at RV parks that have strange fittings so to make our connections stay put we look around for a rock to hold the hose in. I made an extra large "bean bag". I cut the leg from a 2 foot section of old denim pants, secured one end with a plastic zip tie, filled it full of gravel rock and tied the end up with another zip tie. The bag can then be laid over the hose connector to hold it in. The "bean bag" is also useful to hold other items down such as the wagon master sign when its windy.



Recipes

Slow-Cooked Garlic Smashed Potatoes

(Served at the November outing at Betabel)

Submitted by Janice Saylor

Prep Time: 15 min ; Start to Finish: 4 hr 45 min

Makes 14 servings (1/2 cup each)

Ingredients:

3 lb small red potatoes (2-3 inches unpeeled)
4 cloves garlic, finely chopped
2 tablespoons olive oil
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup water
8 oz. container chives-and-onion cream cheese
1/4 to 1/2 cup of milk

Prep:

1. Halve or quarter potatoes as necessary to make smaller pieces.
Place in 4-6 quart slow cooker. Add garlic, oil, salt and water; mix well to coat all potato pieces.
2. Cover; cook on high setting 3 1/2 to 4 1/2 hours or until potatoes are tender.
3. With fork or masher, mash potatoes and garlic cream cheese until well blended. Stir in enough milk to serving consistency. Serve immediately, or cover and leave in slow cooker on low up to 2 hours.
