close up shop this summer.

The Friday night dinner was once again held at the excellent Lucas Restaurant on the Wharf. The food, views and club friends were fantastic. Everyone's meal, from the clams, oysters, to the fish filets all got rave reviews.

Member recipes

Betty's Chili Recipe

1 ½ pounds of steak (cut into bite size pieces) and 1 yellow onion

Sauté the onion and steak until cooked in a pan

1 10 oz. can of tomato sauce

1 28 oz. can of diced tomatoes

1 beef cube

2 15 oz. cans of drained kidney beans

1 10 oz. can of drained corn

1 4.25 oz. can of chopped olives

1 can of beer

Put all the ingredients in a large stock pot. Cook on low for 2-3 hours and then put in spices.

4-5 tbs. of chili powder

1 tsp. of oregano

1 tsp. ground cloves

1 tbs. garlic powder

Cook on low for 1 hour. If too thin, add some corn starch to thicken up.
