

Sadly enough, the outing was over too quickly, as we all had a very enjoyable time. Thanks to everyone for making this outing a success!




#### March 11-16, 2020 <u>FEATHER FALLS KOA, OROVILLE</u> Jack Diggins, Wagon Master

# June 21-15, 2020 Olema Campground, Olema Ernie Curto, Wagon Master








